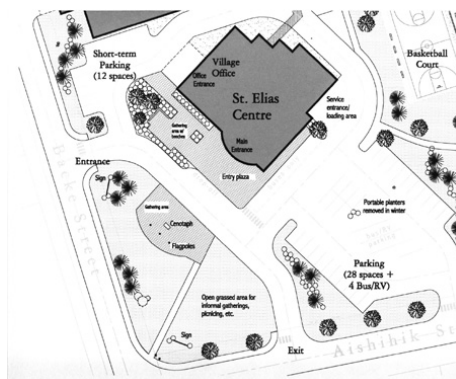

Copper Ridge Place

In a new approach to Northern long-term care facilities, Copper Ridge Place was built on a residential rather than medical management model. Inukshuk worked with residents, staff and experts to create therapeutic gardens that reflected the residents' desires, met the staff's programming requirements and maximized the therapeutic value of the outdoor spaces. Innovations such as the use of poured-in-place resilient rubber paving for increased fall safety were used for the first time in Canada's North.

Haines Junction Block 39 Landscape Plan

Block 39 is the "heart" of the village, containing the municipal offices, the new convention centre, a community centre and key recreational facilities such as the pool and arena. Inukshuk developed a landscape plan for the area that could be undertaken in phases, and that reconciled functional requirements such as the need for adequate parking with the desire to highlight the natural beauty of the surroundings.
